PROPOSAL TO EXTEND BEWDLEY ALCOHOL RESTRICTION ZONE	The Cabinet considered a report from the Chief Executive on the results of the statutory public consultation process for the potential designation of additional public areas in Bewdley, where the drinking of alcohol would be restricted.  The Council is recommended that:  The areas identified on the maps in Appendices A, B and C, respectively, in the report to the Cabinet on 29 <sup>th</sup> September 2005 be designated under the provisions of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001, where restrictions to control anti-social drinking in public places will apply and will be in addition to the existing Alcohol Restriction Zone in Bewdley.
