14. <u>DISTRICT COUNCIL ELECTION DAY - POSSIBLE STRIKE ACTION</u>

In view of the possibility of a strike by UNISON members on 4th May 2006, the day of the District Council Elections, which would affect the availability of some polling stations:

- "(1) Throughout the Council area, whole polling districts be identified as 'polling places', to allow the Returning Officer the discretion to choose suitable alternative premises as polling stations should existing ones not be available as a result of strike action, and
 - (2) in certain exceptional circumstances where no such alternatives exist within a polling district or electoral area (ward), the Returning Officer be authorised to use premises which are partly or wholly outside such areas."
