RESPONDING TO GOVERNMENT AND OTHER PUBLIC BODIES' CONSULTATION PAPERS	The Cabinet Scrutiny Committee considered a report from the Head of Legal and Democratic Services, which detailed how Scrutiny could become more involved in consultations. There have been instances in the past where consultations have bypassed Council meetings due to the requirement to meet tight deadlines and the Council meeting cycle. It is, therefore, proposed that, in future, consultations are referred to the Cabinet Scrutiny Committee, or a relevant Policy and Scrutiny Panel, to make recommendations to the Cabinet and that the Cabinet is given authority to respond on behalf of the Council. This system was trialled successfully at the Housing, Health and Rural Affairs Policy and Scrutiny Panel, which considered the recent NHS consultation on the proposed restructure of Primary Care Trusts. Having discussed the issues surrounding the consultation process, the Committee made the following recommendation:	Mike Oborski Ken Stokes
