1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To note the receipt/award/allocation of external funding.

3.0 BACKGROUND

- 3.1 Cultural Services is particularly proactive in obtaining external funding to support the activities it delivers.
- 3.2 The Community Development section is the most active in this area and has brought in £516,959 of external funding for 2006/07 to date. The role of this section is to empower the local community, working particularly in disadvantaged areas, and relies extensively on partnership working and external funding.
- 3.3 In the last two years Cultural Services has obtained £1,063,473 of external funding (not including £396,000 for Liveability and additional Section 106 monies).
- 3.4 The extent of this external funding has necessitated this to be reported to Committee for budgetary purposes so that the funding can be allocated and the budget amended accordingly.
