Activities

Ward work is somewhat repetitive, answering Members questions and making sure I am seen around the Ward on a daily basis. One of my big successes this last year has been the big improvements that have taken place in the King George V Playing field in Marlpool Lane. This place was a regular haunt of youngsters during the evenings. I had repeated calls from local residents about bad language, vandalism, and alcohol being drunk – all the usual problems that youths cause. I called open meetings between Councillors and residents, including the youths themselves which proved to be very productive. In cooperation with the Cultural, Leisure & Commercial Services Division, fences were improved, the entrance to the park was altered to stop youths sitting on the low walls surrounding the entrance. A new goal post was erected and the pitch marked out away from the road so the ball would not go onto the busy roadway. Also some screening has been put into place to protect the houses that are adjacent to the park. The police have increased patrols in the area and the position is much better all round.

After almost 12 months of negotiations and site meetings I eventually got a badly leaning alder tree cut down on Marlpool Lane, much to the relief and delight of the house holders who would be in line if the tree came down.

I am a member of the Franche Tenants Association attending meetings and periodical walks round and if any problems are found they are acted upon. Pot holes and poor road surfaces are a constant problem. I am forever ringing up the County Council for this end and just occasionally I get some success. I regularly leaflet the Ward members and keep them informed and have had some success in getting mast applications refused in our area. I am also a member of the PACT committee for Franche and regularly attend their meetings.

Achievements During the Year

As Chairman of the Licensing Committee we have had a very busy year. Taxi Deregulation has been an ongoing issue but Deregulation is a fact and the Committee will monitor this on a regular basis. The Gambling Act and Smoking Act have also come before us and training has been given to all Members of the Committee on these important Acts. The Efficiency Panel meets to try and make recommendations and to make our Council more efficient, to curb any excesses in spending and over use and over ordering of materials (paper products) Efficiencies must be made on a year on year basis. Prosperity panel is set up to make like in Wyre Forest as good as we can make it; new amenities, better services and an overall improvement in their daily lives. The Kidderminster Educational Trust gives grants (mostly small ones) to local organisations who put their case to the Committee made up of Councillors of all parties. These applications must have some educational context in their claim. Quite a number of local groups and organisations have benefited from this Trust.

The Youth Task & Finish Group is a Sub-Committee set up to see what facilities are needed by young people in the area for their use and enjoyment, especially in the evenings. To see if any youth clubs are near where they live, if there are any buses in the area that they can use at night so that young people can get out and home at night after visiting others towns and areas. The group has not yet completed its work. We have also engaged the schools in this enterprise and replies are awaited. Hopefully this group can finish its work in the not too distant future.

I have refurbished numerous bus shelters throughout the ward that have been damaged by anti social behaviour.

Also, I have ensured that missing street name plates have been replaced, more litter bins installed and litter hot spots have been reported and tackled.

It is usually the numerous successful individual casework that I see as a major achievement. For instance to give a few examples I got the Council to unblock a drain in a couple's garden that was blocked for 6 months and causing real trouble. I have managed to get Wyre Forest Community Housing to take positive action in a number of OAP's homes to remove damp and refurbish dilapidated walls.

I am a Governor of Offmore First and Comberton First Schools which are currently facing disruption caused by the Wyre Forest Schools Review which will be implemented in September.

My fellow councillors and I are involved with the local PACT (Partners and Communities Together) meetings which are a Police initiative to encourage local communities to work together in identifying problems and working out solutions to them. We have recently secured funding to install a CCTV camera in the alleyway between Chester Road North and the Comberton estate where there have been serious bouts of vandalism.

The Service Policy Panel has looked at the impact of climate change and encouraged the council to become more eco-aware. Out of this work came the initiative to distribute water hogs which, when installed into a toilet cistern, will save a litre of water per flush and, low energy light bulbs to pensioners and people on benefit. These items were kindly donated to the council by various companies.

The Kidderminster Town Centre Partnership is responsible for organising events in the town such as the Christmas celebrations (including the turning on of the lights) and the street markets. Over the last few years we have been investigating ways to acquire funding for a full time Town Centre Manager using partnership working. We feel that this appointment will help to inject vibrancy into the town centre by having someone who will liaise with the shop managers and co-ordinate late night shopping and special events and make Kidderminster a more attractive place to do business in. Hopefully we will be able to appoint in the near future.

The Offmore Comberton Action Group of which I am a member have achieved a tremendous amount of change using the principal of partnership working. We have liaised with the local schools to ascertain how they would like Borrington Road Park to be improved and put those suggestions into action in the hope that young people will subsequently use the Park and take care of it because they have 'ownership'. The group is responding to the requests of local youths to help them to set up football teams. This promises to be a worthwhile project which should reduce the incidence of anti-social behaviour.

We have a problem in our ward of vehicles getting stuck down the narrow lane off Chester Road North at the side of the Cricket Club which is only wide enough for cars halfway down as far as the allotments. After that it narrows and is only suitable for pedestrians, but satellite navigation programmes do not make this clear so we have been having taxis and delivery lorries getting stuck at the end of the lane causing major problems. My fellow ward councillors and I have managed to get the County Council to improve the signs at the beginning of the lane which will hopefully solve the problem.

I negotiated with a builder to rebuild a wall at Wribbenhall, which he paid for at a cost of £3,000.

Other achievements were getting an unadopted light fixed that had not worked since 1972 and road signage erected in Belvadere Crescent and Wassall Way.

I have also installed various dog litter bins which I have located at crucial walking points in Wribbenhall, within the same area I have repaired pot-holes on the road network.

My achievements with the ambulance trust and health care commission were to rectify Satellite Navigational Programmes at Severn Bank Park.

I have also asked residents to improve the gateway to Bewdley by repairing fencing and cutting vegetation outside their properties and this has been a great success as the approach to Bewdley now looks clean and well-maintained.

Finally, due to my discussions with Bewdley Town Council, coaches now drop off holiday makers and visitors in the town and then park up on the outskirts of town at Blackstone Rock Picnic Area or the Far Forest Visitor Centre rather than taking up valuable car parking that is at a premium within the town centre.
