1. <u>PURPOSE OF REPORT</u>

1.1 To receive a report on the Revised Statement of Licensing Policy (in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003) for the Wyre Forest District.

2. <u>RECOMMENDATION</u>

The Committee is asked to RECOMMEND to Cabinet:

2.1 The Revised Draft Statement of Licensing Policy (in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003) for the Wyre Forest District, as set out in Appendix 2 of the report, be approved to enable consultation to commence with relevant stakeholders.

3. <u>BACKGROUND</u>

- 3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 reformed the law of Liquor Licensing and Public Entertainment within England and Wales. It received the Royal Assent on 10th July 2003.
- 3.2 Section 5 of the 2003 Act requires the Council to prepare and publish a statement of its licensing policy every three years.
- 3.3 The first statutory period of licensing began on the 7th January 2005 and will expire on the 6th January 2008.
- 3.4 The Statement of Licensing Policy for this period is attached at **Appendix 1.**

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4. <u>KEY ISSUES</u>

- 4.1 The Council must now review the Policy to determine if revisions are appropriate.
- 4.2 Licensing Data is published widely via the Worcestershire Hub Customer Service Centre and it is essential that information published by the six Worcestershire councils do not conflict.
- 4.3 Licensing Officers operating within the county have drafted a generic Licensing Policy Statement within the Guidelines published by Government under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Copy at **Appendix 2.**

5. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

5.1 Annual Inspection fees may be collected by the Council in respect of Premises Licences when the Policy Statement has been adopted in 2008.

6. LEGAL AND POLICY IMPLICATIONS

6.1 Before determining its policy for any three year period, or if revising a policy within a period, the licensing authority must consult the persons listed in section 5(3) of the 2003 Act.

These are:

- The Chief Police Officer for the District;
- The Fire and Rescue Authority for Hereford and Worcester;
- Persons/ bodies representative of local holders of premises licences
- Persons/ bodies representative of local holders of club premises certificates
- Persons / bodies representative of local holders of personal licences.
- Persons / bodies representative of business and residents in its area.
- 6.2 The views of these bodies should be given proper weight and all of the consultation results will be returned to the Licensing and Environmental Committee before the policy is determined.
- 6.3 Beyond the statutory requirements, it is for each licensing authority to decide the full extent of its consultation, but should have due regard to cost and time.

7. <u>CONCLUSION</u>

7.1 The new policy is generic for the County of Worcestershire and reflects the guidance under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.
