#### 1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To note the receipt, award and allocation of external funding.

### 2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

The Cabinet is asked to DECIDE:-

- 2.1 That the external funding detailed in paragraph four of this report, be noted and allocated to the revenue budget accordingly.
- 2.2 That the allocation of future external funding to the budget be delegated to the Head of Financial Services in consultation with the relevant Cabinet Members.

## 3.0 BACKGROUND

- 3.1 Cultural Services in Community and Partnership Services and the Parks Section in Property and Operational Services are particularly proactive in obtaining external funding to support the activities it delivers.
- 3.2 The Community Development section is very active in this area and has secured £342,270 in external funding for 2007/08 to date. The role of this section is to empower the local community, working particularly in disadvantaged areas, and relies extensively on partnership working and external funding.
- 3.3 In the last two years Cultural Services has obtained £1,063,470 of external funding, (not including £396,000 for Liveability and additional Section 106 monies).
- 3.4 The extent of this external funding has necessitated this to be reported to Committee for budgetary purposes so that the funding can be allocated and the budget amended accordingly.
- 3.5 The first report of this nature was presented to the Cabinet in March 2007.

### 4.0 **EXTERNAL FUNDING**

4.1 The following are all Revenue items and have not been previously reported:

Section106 Shrubbery Street	£12,000	Towards benches, signs and litterbins in Baxter Gardens
Museum	£3,000	Agreed in April 2007, paid October 2007 for Museum Interpretation plan for HLF
Museum	£1,000	From Friends of Bewdley Museum towards Interpretation plan paid in October 2007
Parks	£3,500	Zig Zag project – Springfield Park Wyre Forest Community Housing Group, £2,500 and Broadwaters Community Spirit, £1,000

4.2 Cultural Services is also awaiting the outcome of the Big Lottery Funding application for £207,800 for play projects.
