# 1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To present Cabinet with a draft Conservation Area Appraisal for the Broome Conservation Area, and to seek authority to undertake a public consultation on the proposals.

#### 2.0 RECOMMENDATION

The Cabinet is asked to DECIDE:

2.1 The draft Conservation Area Character Appraisal, as set out in Appendix 1 to the Cabinet Report, be supported and that officers be authorised to undertake a public consultation on the Appraisal before reporting back with a further recommendation.

#### 3.0 BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The Adopted Local Plan states (in para 8.27), the District Council's intention to prepare appraisals for all Conservation Areas.
- 3.2 A Conservation Area Character Appraisal sets out the special architectural and historic characteristics of a Conservation Area and is intended to provide guidance for planning decisions.

3.3 The Broome Conservation Area was designated in 1991 but until now no formal Character Appraisal has been prepared.

#### 4.0 KEY ISSUES

- 4.1 The Draft Conservation Area Character Appraisal has been undertaken in line with guidance from English Heritage published in February 2006.
- 4.2 In order to progress the Conservation Area Character Appraisal, it is considered that a consultation process should be undertaken with all persons and bodies with an interest in the Area. This would include the owner and/or occupier of properties within the boundary of the Area, the parish Council, and other interested parties. The consultation would take the form of public notification of intent, including a press release, a mail-drop to each individual property and interested party, the publication of the Appraisal on the Council's website and a display at the Worcestershire Hub, Kidderminster Town Hall. The consultation would run for a period of 6 weeks, from May 2008 to June 2008.
- 4.3 In line with the approach taken recently for Upper Arley, Harvington and Churchill Conservation Areas no Management Proposals have been produced for Broome Conservation Area.
- 4.4 Local Ward Members and Members of the Community and Regeneration Committee have been consulted on the draft Appraisal. (Any comments received will be included in this report)

#### 5.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

5.1 Arrangements for a public consultation on the draft Conservation Area Appraisal can be undertaken within existing agreed budgets.

#### 6.0 LEGAL AND POLICY IMPLICATIONS

6.1 The proposed Conservation Area Appraisal has been drawn up in accordance with the guidance produced by English Heritage.

#### 7.0 RISK MANAGEMENT

7.1 There are no risk management issues arising from this report.

#### 8.0 CONCLUSION

8.1 A draft Conservation Area Appraisal has been drawn up, and Cabinet is asked to support the proposals for taking this forward to a public consultation, the results of which will be the subject of a future report.
