	Leadership Fund Eligibility Criteria 2008/9

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To recommend an amendment to the eligibility criteria for the Community Leadership fund 2008/9.

2. RECOMMENDATION

2.1 The Cabinet is asked to DECIDE that the eligibility criteria be amended to give Members the freedom and flexibility to spend their individual Community Leadership fund allocation on a District wide initiative provided that there is proven evidence of direct benefits for inhabitants in their Ward.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 Council agreed £42 000 funding for the 2008/9 Community Leadership Fund on 14 May 2008 to continue the fund aimed at responding to local identified needs within the Wyre Forest District.
- 3.2 Cabinet agreed a report in June 2008 recommending a revised application procedure for the Council's Community Leadership Fund 2008/9.
- 3.3 The fund serves to reinforce the "community leadership" role of Council's and provides a resource to enable Councillors to meet and respond to needs within wards and focus on local priorities within the District.
- 3.4 Point 1.2 of the eligibility criteria for 2008/9 states that:-
 - It is recognised that local initiatives may not always be confined to the geography of a single Ward and may, accordingly, involve communities from adjoining Ward

areas. However, once a project proposal extends beyond three adjoining Ward boundaries it ceases to be regarded as a 'local initiative' and therefore is not eligible for consideration for Community Leadership Fund support.

- 3.5 The above criteria would not enable Members to contribute to an initiative that covers more than three wards.
- 3.6 Members have in recent weeks received requests for funding towards projects or initiatives that provide benefits to individuals or groups **residing** within particular Wards but that may not necessarily be a project or initiative **geographically** located in an individual Ward.

4. KEY ISSUES

- 4.1 The amendment to the eligibility criteria for Community Leadership Funding 2008/9 would give Members the freedom and flexibility to contribute to a District wide initiative.
- 4.2 To incorporate the amendment point 1.2 of the eligibility criteria would read as follows:-
 - It is recognised that local initiatives may not always be confined to the geography of a single Ward and may, accordingly, involve communities from adjoining Ward areas. It is advisable that up to 25% of the Community Leadership Fund Ward allocation may be contributed to a project that extends beyond more than one ward provided that there is proven evidence of direct benefits for inhabitants within the individual Ward.

And a new 1.3 created to read as follows:-

- In all cases, applications will be judged on a case by case basis and according to the individual merits of the application, thus enabling flexibility where required.
- 4.3 Any District wide initiative must fulfil **all** eligibility criteria outlined in the application pack and there must be demonstrable evidence of the benefits to people living in the Council Members Ward.
