### 1. <u>PURPOSE OF REPORT</u>

1.1 To propose that the Taxi Trade Liaison Group should be re-appointed to ensure continued consultation between the Council and the Hackney Carriage / Private Hire trade on issues of mutual interest.

### 2. <u>RECOMMENDATION</u>

The Committee is asked to DECIDE that:

- 2.1 Representation on the Liaison Group be re-appointed as per the existing arrangements, consisting of from the Council:
  - the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Licensing and Environmental Committee and one other Member of the Committee; and
  - the Cabinet Member for Housing and Environmental Services.
- 2.2 The Group should meet three times per year to discuss issues of common interest between the Council and the Hackney Carriage / Private Hire trade and report back to this Committee as necessary.

### 3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 In the past, consultation with the Hackney Carriage / Private Hire trade has taken place in a variety of forums namely:
  - The Taxi Trade Task Group
  - Ad hoc meetings with the trade by Officers and Members.
- 3.2 In order to ensure regular and consistent contact with all aspects of the trade, it was felt that the establishment of such a Group was necessary and would aid the Committee in dealing with matters relating to taxis.

- 3.3 On 5<sup>th</sup> September 2005, the Committee decided that a Taxi Trade Liaison Group should be established, meeting three times per year. The initial appointment to the forum was Chair and Vice Chair of Licensing and one other Member of the Committee and the appropriate Cabinet Member. This report is recommending that this format for representation be continued, although the precise make up is a matter for the Committee.
- 3.4 Over the past year, the Liaison Group has met, and has discussed, amongst other things:
  - Hackney Carriage Mixed Fleet
  - Deregulation Plan appraisal
  - Tuk Tuk Vehicles
  - Operational difficulties and complaints
