- The appeal is made under section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 against a refusal to grant planning permission.
- The appeal is made by Mr Ryan Clarke against the decision of Wyre Forest District Council.
- The application Ref: 10/0126/FULL, dated 11 March 2010, was refused by notice dated 7 May 2010.
- The development proposed is loft conversion with associated half hip roof enlargement and rear facing dormer.

Decision

1. I dismiss the appeal.

Main issue

2. The main issue is the effect of the proposal on the character and appearance of the surrounding area.

Reasons

- 3. No 64 is a traditional semi detached dwelling with a hipped roof. The change to the hip of the roof would make it appear unduly bulky. When combined with the introduction of a dormer so close to the edge of the roof it would result in a contrived and incongruous form of development. The change to the hip would also unbalance the pair of semi-detached dwellings since the roof of No 66 is unaltered. This would be very noticeable when viewed from the street. As such, I consider that the proposal would have a significant adverse effect on the character and appearance of the surrounding area and conflict with adopted Wyre Forest Local Plan policy D17.
- 4. I note that numerous other dwellings nearby have been altered and/or extended. However, the majority of these changes have resulted in the creation or retention of a fully hipped roof, albeit with a lower ridgeline in some cases. This would not be the case here. Moreover, I have dealt with this case on its own merits, on the basis of the information before me.
- 5. For the reasons given above and having regard to all other matters raised, I conclude that the appeal should be dismissed.
