# LIC.63 Application for the Renewal of a Hackney Carriage/Private Hire Driver's Licence

The Committee considered a report from the Director of Planning and Regulatory Services which asked the Committee to consider an application for the renewal of a Hackney Carriage/Private Hire Driver's licence. The Licensing Officer informed Members that the Criminal Records Bureau (CRB) document had revealed a disclosure by the police.

The applicant advised Members that he did not think he had done anything wrong.

The Licensing Officer and the applicant left the meeting at this point (10.45am).

Members felt there was no case to answer as the police had "no crimed" the incident. They also felt it was unfortunate that details of the incident remained on the police records causing problems for the applicant.

The Licensing Officer and the applicant returned to the meeting at this point (10.54am).

Decision: The Licensing and Environmental Committee unanimously agreed to grant the application to renew the applicant's Hackney Carriage/Private Hire Driving Licence. This was because there was no evidence that the applicant was not a fit and proper person to have the licence renewed or any Council guidelines had not been adhered to.
