SECTION 136 GRANT AID - STOURPORT TOWN COUNCIL.

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider a request Stourport Town Council for payment of their £15,196 Section 136 Grant Aid for 2010/2011 and £16,780 Section 136 Grant Aid for 2011/12. In addition Stourport Town Council is seeking permission to change the application of £15,000 Section 136 Grant Aid for 2007/08.

2. **RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that you approve:

- All future payments of Section 136 Grant Aid is made automatically to all town and parish councils.
- The application from Stourport Town Council for £15,196 of Section 136 Grant Aid for 2010/11 and £16,780 0f Section 136 Grant Aid for 2011/12;
- The reallocation of the £15,000 of Section 136 Grant Aid for 2007/08;

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 Wyre Forest District Council has for a number of year provided Section 136 Grant Aid to town and parish councils in excess of the amounts which are raised through their own parish precepts.
- 3.2 The value to the smaller parish councils under this scheme are modest the sums which are payable to the two town councils are more significant. Therefore, each year the Cabinet requires Bewdley and Stourport Town councils to submit proposals on how the funds will be applied before any monies are released. Payments to parishes are paid automatically. It is proposed that from 2012/13 that all payments are made automatically.
- 3.3 This report relates to an application which has been received from Stourport Town Council for their remaining funding for 2010/11 and their payment for 2011/12. In addition Stourport Town Council has requested that £15,000 which has previously been allocated to Stourport Pride be now used to support alterative projects.

- 3.4 The proposal from Stourport Town Council is that the remaining £15,196 of Section 136 Grant Aid funding from 2010/11 is combined with the £16,780 of funding for 2011/12. Added to this sum is £15,000 which was approved by Cabinet on 22 November 2007 the Stourport Pride, Stourport Town Council now wish to use this for alternative purposes, this makes a total request for determination of £46,976.
- 3.5 The proposals for the projects which Stourport Town Council would like to spend their Section 136 Grant Aid funding are as follows:

4.1 The value of the grants are included within the Council's budgets, or have already been paid to Stourport Town Council.
