#### 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

To consider the Political and Constitutional Structures for the municipal year 2013/2014.

#### 2. **RECOMMENDATION**

The Council is asked to:

- 2.1 Approve the proposed Political Management Structure for 2013/2014 as set out in Appendix 1 of the report.
- 2.2 Agree the Chairmen and Vice-Chairmen of Committees as contained in Appendix 2. (To follow)
- 2.3 Adopt the Municipal Calendar as set out in Appendix 3.
- 2.4 Agree the appointments to outside bodies as set out in Appendix 4.
- 2.5 Agree the revisions to the Constitution as set out in Appendix 5.
- 2.6 Approve the revised chart of political balance to reflect the new committee structure as set out in Appendix 6.

- 2.7 Appoint a member of the Council to serve as the Armed Forces Champion for Wyre Forest District Council.
- 2.8 Authorise the Director of Community Assets & Localism to settle any outstanding details relating to the political structures and to make changes as necessary to the Council's Constitution to give effect to the Council's decisions and any other revisions necessary to reflect needs or circumstances.

#### 3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 Council is responsible for establishing the political structures which are not the responsibility of the Leader and Cabinet.
- 3.2 Under the Local Government Act 2000 as amended by the Public Involvement in Health Act 2007, the Leader of the Council is responsible for appointments to the Cabinet and allocating responsibilities to Cabinet members. The Council appointed the Leader of the Council under the "strong leader" model in 2011 until Councillor Campion's term of office as a district councillor comes to an end in 2014.
- 3.3 It remains Council's role to establish such Committees as it thinks fit to carry out the discharge of functions which are not the responsibility of the Cabinet. This report addresses the political and constitutional structures for the Council to decide. It also appoints their Chairmen and Vice Chairmen.
- 3.4 There is a need for work involving all the political groups to review the Council's priorities and corporate plan (the current plan expires in 2014) and to undertake policy development work in respect of the medium term financial strategy to address the gap between the Council's expenditure and income.

#### 4. KEY ISSUES

- 4.1 The Administration's proposals for the 2013/2014 political structure are detailed in Appendix 1.The main changes are:
  - 4.1.1 Creating a Strategic Review Committee consisting of 11 members. This would be a time-limited committee for the municipal year 2013/14. Proposed terms of reference are in appendix 5 together with other relevant amendments to the constitution. The Committee would subsume the work done by the Budget Review Panel. The chairman and vice-chairman of the Committee would receive allowances and amendments to the scheme of allowances are set out in appendix 5 accordingly;
  - 4.1.2 Reducing the size of the Overview and Scrutiny Committee to 12 members and amending its terms of reference so that it does not duplicate work being undertaken by the Strategic Review Committee. It is also proposed that the Overview and Scrutiny Committee subsumes the Housing Review Panel which was set up by Council last year for the municipal year 2012/13, to ensure there are sufficient officer resources to support the new structure.

#### **Political Balance**

4.2 Following the elections on 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2012, Councillors formed themselves into political groups of the following numbers. There have been no District Council elections in 2013 and, at the time of printing, the political balance remains the same.

Legislation requires that the aggregate allocation of committee seats must be in accordance with the principles of political balance and proportionality. Subject to this, individual committee membership should reflect the political balance of the Council as far as practicable. Council can depart from these principles provided no member votes against doing so. As usual, it is not possible to achieve precise political balance. The revised political balance of Committees taking account of the changes proposed in section 4.1 is set out in Appendix 6.

#### **Committee Appointments**

4.3 After determining its political structures and allocations of seats to Committees, Council must appoint Chairmen and Vice-Chairmen to Committees. The nominations for these posts are set out in Appendix 2. The Director of Community Assets & Localism will fill other seats in accordance with the nominations from the respective political Groups.

#### **Municipal Calendar**

4.4 The calendar of meetings for 2013/2014, attached at Appendix 3 has been prepared based on the Council's proposed decision-making structure and in accordance with the Council's Standing Orders. Variant dates are provided in May and June 2014 to cater for the possibility that the district council elections will be merged with those for the European Parliament.

#### **Appointments to Outside Bodies**

4.5 Each year the Council appoints Members as representatives on a number of outside bodies. The attached schedule at Appendix 4 details the appointments due at this time and the number of nominations required for each body. Members will note that the appointments are made for the municipal year 2013/14 unless otherwise annotated.

#### **Armed Forces Champion**

4.6 At its meeting on 27<sup>th</sup> February, Council resolved that it would appoint an Armed Forces Champion, the primary function of the office to be improving access to services and support for serving and ex-service men and women. The member selected for the role would also be expected to champion the Armed Forces Community Covenant which, through the Worcestershire Partnership, all

Worcestershire Councils have signed. Council is invited to agree which member should perform this role.

#### 5. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

5.1 The allowances for the chairman and vice-chairman of the proposed Strategic Review Committee would cost £7,350. This can be met within the Council's overall budget. There are no other significant financial implications arising from this report.

#### 6. LEGAL AND POLICY IMPLICATIONS

- 6.1 The proposals comply with the requirements of Section 21 of the Local Government Act 2000 and the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 which require one or more Overview and Scrutiny Committees to be established.
- 6.2 The proposals for the political balance of committees reflect the allocation of seats in accordance with the Local Government and Housing Act 1989.

#### 7. EQUALITY IMPACT NEEDS ASSESSMENT

7.1 An equality assessment impact has been undertaken and it is considered that there are no discernible impacts on the six equality strands.

#### 8. RISK MANAGEMENT

8.1 There are no significant risks associated with the proposed Political Management Structure for 2013/14. The proposed new Committee will allow cross-party work on the major challenge facing the Council, namely aligning expenditure with income in future. There are no risk management issues associated with the proposed changes to the Terms of Reference contained within this report.

#### 9. CONCLUSION

- 9.1 The proposals contained within this report meet the requirements of the relevant legislation including the Local Government Act 2000 and provide clear links to the Council's priorities. The establishment of the Strategic Review Committee will ensure the there is sufficient member debate to develop a new corporate plan and the next stage of the strategy to meet the Council's underlying financial deficit.
- 9.2 The proposed political structure of committees is set out in Appendix 1. The principal changes to the structure of Committees are summarised in paragraph 4.1.
- 9.3 The proposed appointments of Chairmen and Vice-Chairmen for the Council's Committees for the 2013/2014 municipal year are set out Appendix 2 of this report.
- 9.4 The proposed municipal diary of meeting dates for 2013/2014 is set out in Appendix 3 of the report.



#### AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION

#### Part 5 (terms of reference of Council and committees)

In section 5 (Overview and scrutiny committee), insert after paragraph 13 for the municipal year 2013/14 only:

"14 The Overview and Scrutiny Committee shall have no power to consider or scrutinise the work of the Strategic Review Committee; and shall not have power to establish a review panel covering the matters set out in the terms of reference of that committee."

Omit section 5.1 (housing review panel)

Insert new section at end for the municipal year 2013/14 only:

#### "12 Strategic Review Committee

- Testing and developing policy options for the Council's corporate plan and for the
  medium term financial strategy for 2014 onwards. This element of the Committee's
  work will generally be conducted in private through a working group made up of all
  members of the committee. All members of the Council will be able to attend meetings
  of such a working group.
- 2. Recommending to Cabinet the priorities and objectives for the corporate plan and a medium term financial strategy that is aligned with the corporate plan and provides, no later than 2016-17, for the Council's expenditure to match its income.
- 3. Providing a forum for detailed consideration of the Cabinet's proposals for the medium term financial strategy. For the purposes of this element of the committee's functions, it shall have the powers and status of an overview and scrutiny committee."

#### Part 9 (budget and policy framework procedure rules)

Substitute section 2. Process for approving the budget as follows:

"Process for approving the budget

- 1. The Cabinet shall publish proposals for the medium term financial strategy no later than December in each year.
- 2. Following a period of public consultation and scrutiny of the proposed medium term financial strategy, the Cabinet shall make its final recommendations for the medium term financial strategy to Council for approval by full Council.
- 3. In approving the financial strategy, the Council may vary the extent of virement within the budget and the degree of in-year changes to the policy framework, which may be undertaken by the Cabinet, in accordance with paragraphs 7 and 8 of these rules (virement and in-year adjustments). Any other changes to the Policy and Budget Framework are reserved to Council."
