If you have an ODI (as defined in the Code) you will need to consider whether you need to leave the room during the consideration of the matter.

LIC.05 Draft Scrap Metal Licensing Policy and Guidelines

The Committee considered a report from the Head of Worcestershire Regulatory Services (WRS) on behalf of Wyre Forest District Council which sought approval to undertake a 12 week consultation with relevant parties on a proposed draft scrap metal policy and guidelines.

The Senior Practitioner – Licensing (WRS) led Members through the report. He advised that there was no legal obligation for the Council to have a policy in place, however the policy would assist the authority in achieving consistency, fairness and transparency in its decision making process.

He added that it was the intention to ask each of the six district Councils in Worcestershire to adopt a similar policy.

The Committee considered each page of the draft policy and guidelines in turn.

The Chairman welcomed the policy and reminded Members that the results of the consultation would be brought back to the Committee for consideration before the draft policy and guidelines were finalised and approved. He urged Members to submit any comments they had during the consultation period.
