1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1. To consider and determine an application for review of the premises licence issued in respect of the premises below:

**The Secret Garden Bar
17 - 20 New Road
Kidderminster
Worcestershire
DY10 1AF**

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1. On 3rd May 2023 an application was received from PC Angeline Stanley acting on behalf of the Chief Officer of West Mercia Police, for a review of the premises licence in force in respect of:

The Secret Garden Bar, 17 - 20 New Road, Kidderminster, Worcestershire, DY10 1AF.

- 2.2. A copy of the review application and the supporting documentation that accompanied it, is attached at “**Appendix 1**”. Police Body worn CCTV footage will also be made available for members to view during the hearing.
- 2.3. The review application has been submitted by West Mercia Police on the grounds that the licensed premises was identified as being used for the large scale cultivation and production of illegal drugs, namely cannabis. This was confirmed following the execution of a police search warrant under section 23 of the Misuse of Drugs Act.
- 2.4. The full grounds for the application are set out in the application form and relate to the following licensing objective:
- The prevention of Crime and Disorder
- 2.5. It can be confirmed that the application has been advertised in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and associated regulations and that the application has also been served on the licence holder and all of the responsible authorities.
- 2.6. A copy of the existing premises licence is attached at “**Appendix 2**”. The premises licence holder is Mr Mohammad Hassan Ghoncheh. The designated premises supervisor identified on the premises licence is also Mr Mohammad Hassan Ghoncheh.

3. REPRESENTATIONS

Responsible Authorities

- 3.1. No representations have been received from any of the other responsible authorities in respect of the application.

Other Persons

- 3.2. In response to the application, the premises licence holder Mr Ghoncheh has submitted a written representation. A copy of the representation is attached at “**Appendix 3**”.

4. LOCAL POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

- 4.1. The Sub-Committee should have regard to the Council’s Statement of Licensing Policy under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 4.2. The Council’s Statement of Licensing Policy is available to download from the Council’s website or to request a hard copy, contact Worcestershire Regulatory Services on 01905 822799 or email wrsenquiries@worcsregservices.gov.uk

4.3. The Council's Statement of Policy states the following in relation to reviews:

- At any stage, following the grant of a premises licence or club premises certificate, a responsible authority or any other person, may apply to the licensing authority for a review of the licence or certificate because of a problem arising at the premises in connection with any of the four licensing objectives.
- In every case the application for review must relate to particular premises for which a licence or certificate is in force and must be relevant to the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- The licensing authority also expects other responsible authorities to intervene where the basis for the intervention falls within the remit of that other authority. For example, the police should take appropriate steps where the basis for the review is concern about crime and disorder.

5. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

5.1. The Sub-Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to the promotion of the licensing objectives, which are:

- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance;
- the protection of children from harm.

5.2. In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is also obliged to have regard to the guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

5.3. The section 182 guidance states the following in relation to reviews:

5.4. Responsible authorities and other persons may make representations in respect of an application to review a premises licence or club premises certificate. They must be relevant (i.e., relate to one or more of the licensing objectives) and, in the case of other persons, must not be frivolous or vexatious. Representations must be made in writing and may be amplified at the subsequent hearing or may stand in their own right. Additional representations which do not amount to an amplification of the original representation may not be made at the hearing.

5.5. With regards to reviews arising in connection with crime, the guidance goes on to state:

5.6. A number of reviews may arise in connection with crime that is not directly connected with licensable activities. For example, reviews may arise because of drugs problems at the premises, money laundering by criminal gangs, the sale of contraband or stolen goods, the sale of firearms, or the sexual exploitation of children. Licensing authorities do not have the power to judge the criminality or otherwise of any issue. This is a matter for the courts. The licensing authority's role when determining such a review is not therefore to establish the guilt or innocence of any individual but to ensure the promotion of the crime prevention objective.

- 5.7. Where the licensing authority is conducting a review on the grounds that the premises have been used for criminal purposes, its role is solely to determine what steps should be taken in connection with the premises licence, for the promotion of the crime prevention objective. It is important to recognise that certain criminal activity or associated problems may be taking place or have taken place despite the best efforts of the licence holder and the staff working at the premises and despite full compliance with the conditions attached to the licence. In such circumstances, the licensing authority is still empowered to take any appropriate steps to remedy the problems. The licensing authority's duty is to take steps with a view to the promotion of the licensing objectives and the prevention of illegal working in the interests of the wider community and not those of the individual licence holder.
- 5.8. There is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises which should be treated particularly seriously. These are the use of the licensed premises:
- for the sale and distribution of drugs controlled under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 and the laundering of the proceeds of drugs crime
- 5.9. It is envisaged that licensing authorities, the police, the Home Office (Immigration Enforcement) and other law enforcement agencies, which are responsible authorities, will use the review procedures effectively to deter such activities and crime. Where reviews arise and the licensing authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that revocation of the licence – even in the first instance – should be seriously considered.
- 5.10. The Council must also have regards to its own Statement of Licensing Policy.
- 5.11. The Sub-Committee must also have regard to the application, the representations that have been made and the evidence it hears during the hearing.
- 5.12. The Sub-Committee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, which are:
- (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
 - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor;
 - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
 - (e) to revoke the licence;
- 5.13. The Sub-Committee is asked to note that it may not take such steps merely because it considers it desirable to do so, it must actually be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives.
- 5.14. The Sub-Committee having considered the review application may consider that no further action is necessary.

- 5.15. All parties to the hearing will be notified of the Sub-Committee's decision in writing within five working days of the conclusion of the hearing.
- 5.16. Any party aggrieved by a decision taken by the Sub-Committee may appeal against the decision to a Magistrates' Court within 21 days of being notified of the decision.
- 5.17. The hearing should be conducted in accordance with the agreed procedure.

6. FOR DECISION

- 6.1. The Sub-Committee must consider and determine the review application.

Premises used in crime and disorder

In July 2022 police received information that there was cannabis grow at the stated address, due to this a section 23 misuse of drugs act warrant was obtained and executed at the address, a large commercial cannabis grow was found, two males were located at the premises and arrested following a foot chase after they escaped through a smashed window on the first floor of the premises.

The plants were located behind two metal shutter doors on the lower level of the property, seven rooms were located with cannabis in, a highly sophisticated ventilation, heating and hydroponics system inside. Approximately 440 plants including small adult plants, adult non-flowering plants, adult flowering plants that were drying.

Within the building there was also a kitchen, toilet, shower and a bedroom with two mattresses on and very limited personal belongings.

Western Power also attended and found that the electric had also been bypassed.

From the interviewing officer it was thought the grow amounted to around

£200,00.00, however this was not confirmed by a drugs expert witness due to the fact that the two males that were arrested were released with no further action due it being deemed they were in fact victims of modern day slavery.

Two males were found inside the premises, they ran when they saw police but were located in a neighbouring properties back garden and arrested on suspicion of cannabis cultivation, however following interview they were released without charge having been deemed victims of modern day slavery.

When officers entered the premises they found disused bar equipment, there was also alcohol still present on site, the day after the warrant was executed the place was burgled and the alcohol was stolen.

Several officers attended the premises of 'The Secret Garden' to carry out a drugs warrant on 3rd July 2022; officers were PC 21911 RUTTER, PC 21628 TINKLER, PC 21281 WALTERS, PC 22027 MIDDLETON, PC 20400 BRIDGEWOOD, PC 21460 WILLIAMS, PC 21164 STRONG, PC 21691 ESP, PC 21730 JONES and PC 22118 CARTWRIGHT.

PC RUTTER's statement exhibits the seizure of two plants per room showing the different stages of growth, sampling a total of approximately 440 plants. There was also a wall document seized tallying the plants and various stages of growth.

PC WALTERS and PC MIDDLETON's statements both refer to two males running from the premise address; they became aware that these males were detained and arrested. Both officers entered the premise and record more than 4 rooms containing cannabis plants at various stages of growth.

PC BRIDGEWOOD's statement refers to hearing a smashing noise at the rear of the premise and saw a male running away from the address; he was joined by a second male. PC BRIDGEWOOD was the arresting officer for one of these males.

PC STRONG's statement refers to him being the 'method-of-entry' officer and entered second to PC TINKLER. PC STRONG observed a room behind metal shutter doors that contained a cannabis grow inside.

PC ESP exhibits a cannabis grow examination form; her statement refers to a large number of cannabis plants found within the premise and details the environment and equipment where over 400 plants were found.

PC JONES' statement notes whilst the metal shutter doors were being opened, she heard PC CARTWRIGHT calling for assistance outside the premise due to a male at an upstairs window to the premise trying to exit the property. PC JONES joined two officers in pursuit of the two males who exited the address and was the arresting officer for the second male. PC CARTWRIGHT's statement also refers to this pursuit and the seizure of a mobile phone that one of the males tried to discard.

Review of the body worn video shows

Officers inside venue, shows cannabis plants, unknown what room but ground floor, room also contains large amounts of hydroponics, shows a kitchen area which includes kettles, plates of un-eaten food, toilet paper, bottles, bathroom including toilet and sink, sleeping area including bed and mattress and clothing. Officers make their way upstairs, further plants upstairs, large number of plants again in various stages of growth, exit point shown where the males have escaped onto a roof, and officers return back downstairs.

EXHIBIT LE/05- PC 21691 ESP

Officers attend the SG and MOE (method of entry) is being used to gain entry, officers enter and find a locked door, officers enter and walk around the ground floor and through the bar area, this is clear of plants. Two roller doors found on the left hand side (exterior of property, entry attempted to be gained by one-unsuccessful) males then seen upstairs-ripped insulating off wall and attempted to make off, males now on the roof, officers conducting general area search, male 1 located, arrested and placed in the rear of a van. Second male located, arrested and placed in a van, ambulance called due to injury sustained following his escape. Other officers continue to attempt to gain entry via the shutters and MOE. Entry gained and cannabis cultivation found, large number of plants found inside, kitchen and toilet area located. Officers make their way upstairs and locate more plants, working from the right hand side to the left recording the plants on BWV as well as taking photographs, clothing all found upstairs, small number of plants seized by officers from upstairs. Discussion between officers-potential 1m grow. Officers discuss with PIC how he obtained his head injury so as to pass information on to ambulance, however there was a language barrier, it was established that the males were Albanians, male was taken to MIU by officers.

MR MOHAMMAD HASSAN GHONCHEH was interviewed and provided all the relevant papers and documents for his rental agreement. However when the details were checked by police they were all found to be fake.

The opinion of the interviewing CID officer is that MR GHONCHEH rented the premises out after receiving a cash payment for the full term, and probably wasn't too concerned with what they were doing there. However, there's no evidence that he was involved in the grow or had any knowledge.

MR GHONCHEH did not do any checks on the premises and had he done so, then maybe the grow would have been found and dealt with by MR GHONCHEH.

There is photographic evidence also of the set up and grow, photos also show the electric being by passed, sleeping areas, kitchen and toilet areas, a number of rooms with plants at various stages of growth, fans temperature gauges, clothing for the males and towels, the gap/hole in the wall that the males used to escape from, items from the previous use/bar, posters on the wall advertising events at the club, rubbish and food items used by the two males that were arrested.

West Mercia Police are looking to have the licence revoked from MR GHONCHEH for failing to maintain that the premises were kept in order and free from the use of being concerned in crime and disorder.

LICENSING ACT 2003
MANDATORY CONDITIONS - APPLICABLE TO ALL PREMISES LICENCES
Condition 1 Section 19 Licensing Act 2003

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under this premises licence-
- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (2) **Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.**

Condition 2 Section 20 Licensing Act 2003

- (1) The admission of children to the exhibition of any film is restricted by age classification awarded to the film by the British Board of Film Classification.

(2) Where-

a) The film classification is not specified admission of children must be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of the licensing authority.

- "children" means under 18.

Condition 3 Section 21 Licensing Act 2003

(1) Where individuals are at the premises to carry out a security activity such as door supervision, each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

(2) But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed-

a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c12) (premises with premises licence authorising only plays or films), or

b) in respect of premises in relation to-

I. any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) of (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or

II. any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).

(1) For the purposes of this section-

a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and

b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

THE LICENSING ACT 2003 (MANDATORY LICENSING CONDITIONS) ORDER 2010
Statutory Instrument 2010 No 860

Conditions 1, 2 and 3 come into force on the 6th April 2010. Whilst conditions 4 and 5 come into force on the 1st October 2010

Conditions 1, 3 and 5 do not apply to premises licences where it authorises only the sale by retail off the premises.

Condition 1

(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—

(2)(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(2)(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(2)(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(2)(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—

- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
- (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(2)(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

Condition 2

The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

Condition 3

The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Condition 4

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

Condition 5

The responsible person shall ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

(a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e):

(b) **The Prevention of Crime and Disorder:**

CCTV will be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of EVIDENTIAL QUALITY in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition

Cameras shall encompass all ingress and egress to the premises, fire exits, outside areas, and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol occurs.

Equipment MUST be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped and kept for a period of 31 days and handed to the Police on demand.

The Premises Licence Holder must ensure at all times a DPS or appointed member of staff is capable and competent at downloading CCTV footage in a recordable format to disc for the Police or the Local Authority officer on demand.

The Recording equipment and tapes/discs shall be kept in a secure environment under the control of the DPS or other responsible named individual. An operational daily log report must be maintained and endorsed by signature, indicating the system has been checked and is complaint, in the event of any failings actions taken are to be recorded.

On Fridays and Saturdays one SIA Licensed Door staff shall be employed at the premises from 22.00 until the termination of licensable activities.

The DPS will employ SIA door staff at other times when risk assessment dictates door supervision to be necessary.

A person approved in writing by the DPS shall be on duty within the licensed area of the premises at all times when the premises operate for the sale of alcohol.

A 30 minute drinking up time at the end of the hours granted for the licensable activity of the sale of alcohol.

A policy in relation to the seizure and disposal of drugs shall be written down and kept at the premises. Such policy shall have met with the agreement of the local Police licensing officer for the area and be signed off by them. The policy shall be produced on demand of a Police officer.

Secured alarmed premises

Well lit premises

(c) **Public Safety:**

CCTV 24 hour monitoring

(d) **The Prevention of Public Nuisance:**

To adhere to required limit of music decibels

To work/liaise with neighbouring premises

Try to ensure guests leave quietly and respectfully at the end of the evening

(e) **The Protection of Children from Harm:**

The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 policy. Such policy shall be written down and kept at the premises. The policy shall be produced on demand to a Police Officer

No person under the age of 16 years shall be permitted to be on the premises after 21.00 hrs.

Bar staff must ask for proof of age ID whenever the customer appears to be under 25. If there is any doubt as to the age of the customer they will be refused service.

Proof of attainment of 18 years of age will be required through production of a PASS card; full or provisional photo card driving licence; or by a photo passport, prior to any alcohol sale taking place.

A register of refusals will be kept with the names of people who have been unable to provide identification to prove their age. These records will be made available to the Licensing Authority on request.

PREMISES LICENCE GUIDANCE

1. Your Premises Licence has been granted and is enclosed.

2. The annual fee is due on 24 November, unless you are exempt (e.g. community premises). Please ensure that the annual fee is paid on time.
3. Your Premises Licence has been granted for an unlimited period of time and is subject to the conditions mentioned in the licence.
4. You must ensure that the Premises Licence, or a certified copy of it, is kept at the premises in the custody or under the control of yourself or a person ("the nominated person") who works at the premises and whom you have nominated in writing for these purposes. A person commits an offence if he or she fails, without reasonable excuse, to comply with these requirements. The maximum fine is £500 on conviction.
5. You must ensure that a Summary of the Premises Licence, or a certified copy of that Summary, is prominently displayed at the premises. If you have nominated a person ("the nominated person"), under 4 above, you must prominently display at the premises a notice specifying the position held at the premises by that person. A person commits an offence if he or she fails, without reasonable excuse, to comply with these requirements. The maximum fine is £500 on conviction.
6. A Police Constable or an Authorised Person may require the holder of the Premises Licence or the nominated person to produce the Premises Licence, or a certified copy of it, for examination. A person commits an offence if he or she fails, without reasonable excuse to comply with these requirements. The maximum fine is £500 on conviction.
7. Where a Premises Licence or Summary is lost, stolen, damaged or destroyed, the holder of the licence may apply to the Council for a copy of the licence or Summary. A fee of £10.50 is payable.
8. Subject to reinstatement in certain circumstances, a Premises Licence lapses if the holder the licence dies, becomes mentally incapable, becomes insolvent, or is dissolved.
9. Where the holder of a Premises Licence wishes to surrender their licence they may give the Council notice to that effect. The notice must be accompanied by the Premises Licence or, if that is not practicable, by a statement of the reasons for the failure to provide the licence. The Premises Licence lapses on receipt of the notice by the Council.
10. The holder of a Premises Licence must, as soon as reasonably practicable, notify the Council of any changes in:
 - Name and address
 - Name and address of the Designated Premises Supervisor (unless that Supervisor has already notified the Council)

The notice must be accompanied by the Premises Licence or, if that is not practicable, by a statement of the reasons for the failure to provide the licence. The Premises Licence lapses on receipt of the notice by the Council. A fee of £10.50 is payable. A person commits an offence if he or she fails, without reasonable excuse, to comply with these requirements. The maximum fine is £500 on conviction.
11. The holder of a Premises Licence may apply to the Council at any time for variation of the licence. Amongst other things, an application form will need to be completed, a fee will need to be paid and the application will need to be advertised and served on the Responsible Authorities. Please contact the Council for an application form and a guidance leaflet on how to apply for a variation. Please note that a Licence may not be varied to extend the period for which a licence has effect, or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates – in those cases an application for a new Premises Licence will need to be made; please contact the Council for further details.

12. The holder of a Premises Licence may, if the licence authorises the supply of alcohol (or if it is intended to vary a licence so that it authorises the supply of alcohol), apply to vary the licence so as to specify the individual named in the application as the Designated Premises Supervisor. Amongst other things, an application form will need to be completed, a fee will need to be paid and the notice of the application must be given to the Police. It is possible for the applicant to ask for such a variation to have immediate effect on an interim basis. Please contact the Council for an application form and guidance leaflet on how to apply for a variation.
13. The Premises Licence may be transferred following an application made to the Council for a transfer of the Licence. Amongst other things, an application form will need to be completed, a fee will need to be paid and notice of the application must be given to the Police. It is possible for the applicant to ask for a transfer to have immediate effect on an interim basis. Please contact the Council for an application form and a guidance leaflet on how to apply for a transfer.
14. Where a Premises Licence has effect, and Interested Party or a Responsible Authority may apply to the Council for a review of the licence. You will be notified if an application is made to review your Premises Licence and you will have the opportunity to make representations about a review and to attend before the Council's Licensing Committee.
15. Your attention is drawn in particular to Part 7 of the Licensing Act 2003 which concerns offences under the Licensing Act 2003.



I relayed this information back over the airway to the other officers that were located on another two access points that we had covered to make them aware of potential individuals making their way to them.

As I entered back into the property I heard loud banging and a noise that sounded like someone running across the top of the roof. PC 21334 SMITH activated her red button to speak across the airway and shouted that two males had just exited on to the roof of the property and were now running away across roofs making their way towards TESCO petrol station on the roundabout located on NEW ROAD, KIDDERMINSTER.

Male Two I can describe as a white eastern European, approximately late 30's, 5ft 8 in height, with a shaven head and a brown and greying beard. This male was wearing a white tshirt with 'ANSWER' motif on the front and blue jeans with green pumps.

I then noticed a blonde female come into view and I shouted at her to stay where she was. She stated that these males had just run across her roof and scared her and her small child so I asked her if she could come and open the gates to give us access to the carpark.

The two males had at this point climbed over some fencing to the right of the carpark which led onto a rear garden. As PC 20400 BRIDGEWOOD and PC 22118 CARTWRIGHT climbed over the fencing I banged on the property door and was let into the property by the owner.

I gained access to the rear garden by a locked back door and was met by the other officers. Neither of the males were in the garden but PC 22118 CARTWRIGHT stated that he had saw movement in the next garden under tarpauling. PC BRIDGEWOOD and PC CARTWRIGHT lifted two fence panels and I gained access to the garden through these. The two males were found under the tarpauling.

I shouted at the male I described as male two to stay where he was as I approached him. He had blood coming from a wound on his head that he had already obtained by the time that officers had located them.

At 15:49hrs I arrested the male I now know to be [REDACTED] cannabis cultivation, placed him in cuffs to the rear and explained that I would be taking him to custody after I had got a trained medical professional to assess the wound to his head. At this point [REDACTED] suggested he spoke no English and was ALBANIAN.

I seized [REDACTED] Samsung mobile phone from him and can exhibit this as RJ/1. This was a SAMSUNG phone in a black phone case.

As I escorted him to the police van I asked comms to call for an ambulance to assess his head.

At 16:40hrs an ambulance arrived on the scene and checked [REDACTED] over, the deemed that he needed to go to WORCESTER ROYAL HOSPITAL for a head CT scan and for the wound to be dealt with.

PC 22118 CARTWRIGHT drove the police van and I made my way to the hospital in the back of the ambulance with [REDACTED]

We timed on at the hospital at 17:44hrs here [REDACTED] was then given medical treatment for the wound before being discharged at 20:26hrs where we then made our way back to KIDDERMINSTER CUSTODY. We arrived at custody at 20:55hrs where [REDACTED] was booked into and his detention was authorised.

At 1530hrs I attended a drugs warrant at THE SECRET GARDEN BAR, NEW ROAD, KIDDERMINSTER where intelligence suggested a cannabis grow was inside I was initially positioned at the side door entrance on Aldi Car Park to ensure nobody tried to escape whilst other officers entered the building, in company with PC 21334 SMITH We then re located as other Officers had our entrance covered and got as close as we could to the rear of the property, which was not accessible We went through a gate from NEW ROAD, in to the rear gardens and under a fence to monitor the rear of the property

PC 22118 CARTWRIGHT was at the front and shouted via the radio that someone was trying to get out the top window. I then heard a smashing noise at the rear of the property and saw a male running across the garage, who jumped to the neighbouring roof followed by a second male I ran through the gardens observing the two males jumping across roofs, hearing tiles breaking as they were jumping. The two males then appeared to be stuck on one of the roofs and I shouted for them to stop They then appeared to jump down the other side out of view I ran back to the roadside and ran up the road in to the direction where they were going in

I went further up NEW ROAD to houses that were set back behind a black security gate where I heard a female shouting I then saw both males appear and climb the fence to the rear of the properties The female came and opened the gate so we could get in.

I lifted the fence panel and saw the two males which were the same two males who I witnessed running from SECRET GARDEN BAR moments earlier and jumping roofs I went over to the one male who I now know to [REDACTED] and handcuffed him to the rear stacked position, as I was doing this he put his left hand towards his pocket and was taken to the floor to prevent him getting anything that could cause harm PC CARTWRIGHT assisted and I placed the handcuffs on, double locked them and checked them for comfort At 1551hrs I arrested him on suspicion of cultivation of cannabis, cautioned him and informed him it was necessary for a prompt and effective investigation and to prevent escape It was also in order to ascertain his details, name, DOB and address I asked [REDACTED] what nationality he was and he replied [REDACTED]

I would describe [REDACTED] as a white male, 5ft10 with a stocky build, he had shaved brown hair with a short dark coloured beard He was wearing a black coat, dark coloured shorts and had no shoes on [REDACTED] was the first male that ran from SECRET GARDEN







Nothing of note, officers stood to the left of the SG observing following two males exiting the roof area of the building and being pursued by police. Males not seen on this BWV

EXHIBIT KW/1- PC 21460 WILLIAMS

Officers inside venue, shows cannabis plants, unknown what room but ground floor, room also contains large amounts of hydroponics, shows a kitchen area which includes kettles, plates of un-eaten food, toilet paper, bottles, bathroom including toilet and sink, sleeping area including bed and mattress and clothing. Officers make their way upstairs, further plants upstairs, large number of plants again in various stages of growth, exit point shown where the males have escaped onto a roof, and officers return back downstairs.

EXHIBIT LE/05- PC 21691 ESP

Officers attend the SG and MOE (method of entry) is being used to gain entry, officers enter and find a locked door, officers enter and walk around the ground floor and through the bar area, this is clear of plants. Two roller doors found on the left hand side (exterior of property, entry attempted to be gained by one- unsuccessful) males then seen upstairs-ripped insulating off wall and attempted to make off, males now on the roof, officers conducting general area search , male 1 located, arrested and placed in the rear of a van. Second male located, arrested and placed in a van, ambulance called due to injury sustained following his escape. Other officers continue to attempt to gain entry via the shutters and MOE. Entry gained and cannabis cultivation found, large number of plants found inside, kitchen and toilet area located. Officers make their way upstairs and locate more plants, working from the right hand side to the left recording the plants on BWV as well as taking photograph's, clothing all found upstairs, small number of plants seized by officers from upstairs. Discussion between officers-potential 1m grow. Officers discuss with PIC how he obtained his head injury so as to pass information on to ambulance, however there was a language barrier, it was established that the males were Albanians, male was taken to MIU by officers.

ANNEX 1 – MANDATORY CONDITIONS

The making and authorisation of alcohol sales

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence—

- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Irresponsible alcohol promotions

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Provision of free potable water

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Age verification policy for the sale or supply of alcohol

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Availability of small measures of alcohol

The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Permitted price of alcohol

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
 - a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979);
 - b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P=D+(D\times V)$$

where—

P is the permitted price,

D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

- c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - e) “valued added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
 4.
 - (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Security activity

Where individuals are at the premises to carry out a security activity, as defined by the Private Security Industry Act 2001, each such individual must be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under that Act or be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of that Act.

ANNEX 2 – CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e):

b) The prevention of crime and disorder:

CCTV will be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of EVIDENTIAL QUALITY in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition

Cameras shall encompass all ingress and egress to the premises, fire exits, outside areas, and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol occurs.

Equipment MUST be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped and kept for a period of 31 days and handed to the Police on demand.

The Premises Licence Holder must ensure at all times a DPS or appointed member of staff is capable and competent at downloading CCTV footage in a recordable format to disc for the Police or the Local Authority officer on demand.

The Recording equipment and tapes/discs shall be kept in a secure environment under the control of the DPS or other responsible named individual. An operational daily log report must be maintained and endorsed by signature, indicating the system has been checked and is complaint, in the event of any failings actions taken are to be recorded.

On Fridays and SATurdays one SIA Licensed Door staff shall be employed at the premises from 22.00 until the termination of licensab;le acitivities.

The DPS will employ SIA doorstaff at other times when risk assessment dictates door supervision to be necessary.

A perosn approved in writing by the DPS shall be on duty within the licensed area of the premises at all times when the premises operate for the sale of alcohol.

A 30 minute drinking up time at the end of the hours granted for the licensable activity of the sale of alcohol.

A policy in relation to the seizure and disposal of drugs shall be written down and kept at the premises. Such policy shall have met with the agreement of the local Police licensing officer for the area and be signed off by them. The policy shall be produced on demand of a Police officer.

Secured alarmed premises

Well lit premises

c) Public safety:

CCTV 24 hr monitoring

d) The prevention of public nuisance:

To adhere to required limit of music decibels

To work/liaise with neighbouring premises

Try to ensure guests leave quietly and respectfully at the end of the evening

e) The protection of children from harm:

The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 policy. Such policy shall be written down and kept at the premises. The policy shall be produced on demand to a Police Officer

No person under the age of 16 years shall be permitted to be on the premises after 21.00 hrs.

Bar staff must ask for proof of age ID whenever the customer appears to be under 25. If there is any doubt as to the age of the customer they will be refused service.

Proof of attainment of 18 years of age will be required through production of a PASS card; full or provisional photo card driving licence; or by a photo passport,prior to any alcohol sale taking place.

A register of refusals will be kept with the names of people who have been unable to provide identification to prove their age. These records will be made available to the Licensing Authority on request.

I am writing regarding my premises license at secret garden (17 to 20 new road Kidderminster). I would like to bring to your attention my points below and hopefully you could kindly consider that I can keep my premises license please.

I have hold a premises license for over 30 years as well as letting property and never experienced a situation like this before.

From January 2022 to mid July 2022 with my health issues which involving chemotherapy followed by mager operation on 1st of April then followed by two months of another chemotherapy and I was unable to visit any of my properties, this being said, if it wasn't for my health issues, I would have been able to visit my properties and no situation like this would have happened.

I opened the Aurora cocktail bar at secret garden two month before the Covid 19 pandemic lockdown.

I have spent a substantial amount of money, roughly 80 thousand pounds in the creation of this bar. Not only am I a victim in this situation but also during the police raids and after at my property, there it's been an extreme amount of damage done which I have now got to deal with as well, considering I only let a room on my property for storage only.

Finally I would greatly appreciate if you could kindly take the time and read through the points above and consider your recommendations regarding my premises license please.
